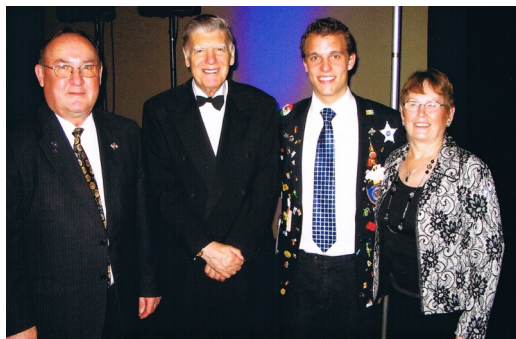
The future of Rotary is in your hands
